

NOT FOR PROFIT ORGANIZATIONS

In accordance with state laws, civic, fraternal, social, religious, etc. organizations, which qualify for tax-exempt status, and operate less than thirty (30) days in a calendar year, are also exempt from compliance with Public Health Laws.

Tax exempt status does not exempt an organization from liability or reduce it's risk of initiating a food borne outbreak. In order to hasten the process should a food outbreak investigation occur, the Marshall County Health Department requires a non-profit information sheet be filled out and returned to the Health Department prior to the event.
